


Figure 1: In week 05-2024, disease trends of ILI and acute diarrhea (non-cholera).




Figure 2: In week 05-2024, ILI has the upper trend with 1027 cases followed by acute diarrhea (non-cholera) 153 cases.










Figure 3: There is increase in number of AD (non-Cholera) & in ILI cases week 05-2024.

Expanded Program on Immunization activities of Health Department ICT

EPI in Pakistan is coordinated at Federal Directorate of Immunization under the Ministry of National Health Services and Regulation Coordination (NHSR&C). The EPI program shall be including vaccines for prevention of vaccine preventable diseases among the adolescents and older age groups as the evidence of vaccines' effectiveness is acquired and advised by the NITAG. The immunization schedule shall thus be periodically updated as and when required depending upon the local disease burden and requirements. The health department with an objective to improve the health of all works on prevention of the diseases EPI is one of the major components. The EPI at district level is managed and supported by staff at district level and the EPI services are provided at Union council level through Fixed Centers, Outreach Vaccination sites and mobile if applicable.




Figure 4: In week 05-2024, total coverage vaccine wise. BCG 321, Penta I 389, Penta II 361, Penta III 369, MR I 314, MR II 340, TD-I 116, TD-II 96, TD-III 8 and TD-IV 2.










Figure 5: In week 05-2024, Total static coverage was 1336, Outreach total was 936, Zero dose covered were 172, and defaulter covered were 209.




Figure 6: There is vaccine coverage of Public private partnership with private hospitals. In week 05-2024 a total of 791 doses of different antigen were given by hospitals in private sector.







DHO Meeting with Pak PWD Team: Project Updates and Collaboration

A meeting, chaired by the District Health Officer Dr Zaeem Zia, included the Pak-PWD team, Development & Administration sections of the DHO office, and the UHC unit. PWD provided updates onthe ongoing health development project in Bhara Kahu, including the upgradation of existing facilities related to electric, mechanical, and civil works. The discussion covered project costs and financial considerations, with the DHO instructing the PWD team to ensure timely completion and adherence to the Bill of Quantities (BOQ) standards.









Health Schemes Update Meeting Highlights

DHO presided over a meeting during which the PAK-PWD team provided updates on ongoing health schemes throughout Islamabad, covering both civil and electrical works. The DHO instructed the PWD team to uphold work quality and adhere to the standards outlined in the BOQs.









UNICEF Support for Safe Childbirths in ICT Communities

UNICEF Pakistan supported the District Health Office in ensuring safe childbirths in ICT communities. UNICEF provided logistical support in the form of essential medicines, delivery kits, and health house signboards distributed by DHO-ICT Dr. Zaeem Zia to Lady Health Workers (LHWs). This initiative aims to empower these frontline healthcare providers by equipping them with essential tools, enabling them to conduct deliveries within the community and contribute to improved maternal and child health.









Successful Free Medical Camp at Humak Dispensary

The District Health Office ICT, in collaboration with the Department of ICT Employees Social Security, AGHAZ (a Social Welfare organization), and Islamabad Diagnostic Centre, organized a successful free medical camp at Humak Dispensary.

Over 650 patients received treatment and medication, including services such as eye check-ups, psychiatry, gynecology, pediatrics, family planning, dermatology, and general medical consultations. The Islamabad Diagnostic Centre provided free HbA1c, BSR, and other laboratory tests, primarily focusing on Hepatitis B and C screening.















Pharmacies Sealed for Violations by Health Office

The Drug Inspectors from the District Health Office have sealed multiple pharmacies due to violations in prices and product quality, as well as for not maintaining records of controlled drugs.
